#### Repsect Life

Pope Francis has identified five key elements for Catholic Pro Life/ Respect for Life work affirming that "in theological study, a pastoral perspective and attention to the wounds of humanity should never be missing."

- Care for the dignity of the human person in different ages of existence.
- Reciprocal respect between the sexes and among the generations.
- Defense of the dignity of every single human being.
  Promotion of the quality of human life that integrates material
- Promotion of the quality of human life that integrates material and spiritual values.
- An "authentic human ecology," which can help restore "the original balance of creation between the human person and the entire universe.

This is an important signal about how Pope Francis wants the Church's pro-life activity to develop. The pontiff has stated that he wants the activity of Vatican offices dedicated to marriage, family and life issues to be "ever more clearly inscribed within the horizon of mercy."

#### APPROVAL OF 8 INDIGENOUS RECONCILIATION FUND APPLICATIONS

**DATE: November 16, 2023** 

The <u>Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops</u> announced in the Fall of 2021 a nation-wide collective financial commitment in the amount of \$30 million dollars for the <u>Indigenous Reconciliation Fund</u> (IRF.) The purpose of the IRF is to support healing, community building, and knowledge sharing initiatives for residential school survivors, their families, and their communities. The Roman Catholic Diocese of Peterborough pledged the sum of \$400 000 to the IRF.

FNMI residents and organizations within the territory of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Peterborough are eligible to apply to the Indigenous Reconciliation Fund which is coordinated by a Local IRF Committee. The first round of applications was received in late September and the committee met in October to review the IRF applications and to make recommendations to the <u>National Indigenous Reconciliation Fund Board of Directors</u>.

Georgie Horton-Baptiste, Chair of the Local IRF Committee is pleased to announce that eight projects were recommended to the National Indigenous Reconciliation Fund Board of Directors and the projects have now been approved.

Chairperson, Georgie Horton-Baptiste spoke about the committee's work saying, "The paths of truth, reconciliation and healing is two-fold for Indigenous peoples and three-fold for Canadians. While the greater onus for reconciliation is not ours to carry as Indigenous peoples, reparational acts of reconciliation will be fleeting and futile without our participation. The intertwined paths of truth and healing is one we can walk together with our friends. Our local Indigenous Reconciliation Fund Committee invited the Indigenous community to submit project proposals that reflect healing, knowledge sharing, and community building initiatives for residential school survivors, their families and communities. I am filled with joy to see that the Round One project proposals that were recommended to the National IRF committee were approved. I look forward to seeing these projects brought to fruition in their respective communities."

Projects funded by the IRF fall into one or more of these four categories:

- Healing for communities and families,
- Culture and language revitalization;
- Knowledge-sharing, heritage & traditions and community building; and/or
- Dialogues for promoting indigenous spirituality and culture.

Approximately \$160 000 worth of projects have been approved in the first round of applications leaving a residual of \$240 000 in the Diocese's IRF. Round 2 will open in early December. Gayelyn Heffernan, Métis Nation of Ontario - Peterborough and District Wapiti Métis Councillor, Vice Chair of the Local IRF Committee, says, "I am very pleased that the Canadian

Conference of Catholic Bishops has undertaken a commitment to support healing and cultural revitalization initiatives for residential school survivors, their families, and their communities. The projects forwarded to the National Committee were all very worthy of support and will be of healing benefit to the communities within which they will be undertaken. I am honoured to sit on the IRF Committee as a representative of the Metis Nation of Ontario, and to be part of this good work."

Bishop Miehm expressed his appreciation and hope saying, "I am grateful to the members of our local IRF committee, who thoroughly reviewed these proposals and recommended them to the national committee for approval. Their work has supported these excellent projects which will serve the various First Nations and Metis communities and which will enhance the important and ongoing journey of walking together."
